## FROM A FARMER'S DAUGHTER - DYNAMIC TAMMY

### A Memorable Thanksgiving for our family.

Many of you may know by now that our son Brandon was severely burned over 38% of his body, in a Bonfire incident on October 14th. It was just after the Pulaski Homecoming game when Brandon arrived at the Bonfire, that was only a few miles from where I grew up in the Township of Maple Grove. He was to attend the Homecoming dance the next day. He was only minutes away from leaving to take care of me (because I was home alone and had a difficult time getting

around because of my broken leg). As a result of two individuals throwing a 55 gallon drum of diesel and gas onto the fire, this did not happen. Brandon along with several other individuals were directly hit by fire. In less than the blink of an eye, ours lives were forever changed.

As a farmer's daughter, one thing that I've learned from them is to never give up. Farming certainly had its ups and downs. Bad things happened, but Mom and Dad never gave up. At times there were challenges, like the time the heifers were spooked and broke through the gates and fled in all directions. I remember how we all worked together to get them back. Adrenaline gave us the power to run through ditches of water, mud and unknown territory to try and find them in early morning hours. Many hours later, we were able to round all of them up in a farmer's yard miles away, exhaustion set in, but also relief, because the worst was over. It's kind of how I felt and still am feeling as a result of Brandon's accident. Exhausted and relieved, because the worst (we hope) is over. We have to put the pieces of our lives back together. For Brandon, his full-time job is to work hard on

getting his body back to as close as normal as humanly possible.

We've encountered a bump in the road, Brandon says "not just a bump in the road, an entire bridge has crashed." Our lives are slightly detoured. Brandon is healing emotionally and physically. He is learning that the road to healing is slow and hard. He is learning how to persevere and push through pain. We are learning how to work remotely, and a lot less time at the office. We've had to rely on our employees to steer the ship. They've taken on more responsibilities than ever before. Plus our customers have shown us empathy, generosity and patience along the way. I believe that since we've surrounded ourselves with good and loving

Our community, communities around us, family, friends, past employees, neighbors, schools, relatives, students, and people we have never met, have come together and are helping us get through this. We've been inundated with cards, inspirational messages, phone calls, visits, home cooked meals, home cleaning services,





### GEARING UP FOR 2023 TIPS TO HELP YOU WITH YOUR COMPANY GOALS FOR THE NEW YEAR.

Here are a few tips to make your first quarter meeting successful. These pointers can help you reach your year end goals, or at least get closer to them.

**First**, it's important you don't set too many goals for the year. If you do, it can be too overwhelming and you can easily lose your focus. Each quarter, we set 3-4 goals that we call "rocks" that help us get closer to our year end goals. There is one person in charge of each rock. The key words are "in charge". **Second**, make sure these goals are attainable, however, make sure you don't make them too easy. Challenge yourself. At times, we probably set our goals too high, and we don't always achieve it 100%, but more often than not, we get really close.

**Third**, create a plan of action for each specific goal, then work backwards to attain your goal. Create weekly tasks "baby steps" to get closer to your goal. It makes the goal actually seem attainable. Each individual must develop a plan of action, and report each week on the progress of what they are doing to reach their quarterly goal.

PS - Don't forget to write these goals down.
